

Inclusive FM & The Equality Act

1-day course

Aim

To explore the benefits of universal design, and inclusive practices for the benefit of all building and service users – including people of varying abilities, cultures and backgrounds.

Objectives

By the end of this course you will be able to:

Develop FM strategies that allow for the variety in human need

Understand the social and economic drivers behind inclusive principles

Champion accessibility and human factors in the workplace

Combine the demands for legislative compliance and sustainability with comfortable and attractive facilities

Adopt a fresh approach to discrimination and safety issues

Understand the need for fire evacuation strategies for disabled people, including the development of Personal and Generic Emergency Escape Plans for staff and visitors

Description

This course is tailored to the needs of the facilities and estates manager - blending practical awareness training with facilities management issues, management policies and procedures and universal design considerations

The course provides a holistic approach to accessibility - giving delegates an all-round perspective on DDA, Fire and safety legislation and how it impacts on human performance and comfort in the workplace.

The day includes plenty of workshop participation and practical sessions, including an audit of the venue for safety, fire and accessibility issues. Attendees will leave with their own Action Planning list for access and egress to develop further back at their workplace - plus lots of ideas for ways to improve the flexibility of services and facilities at little or no cost or disruption.
